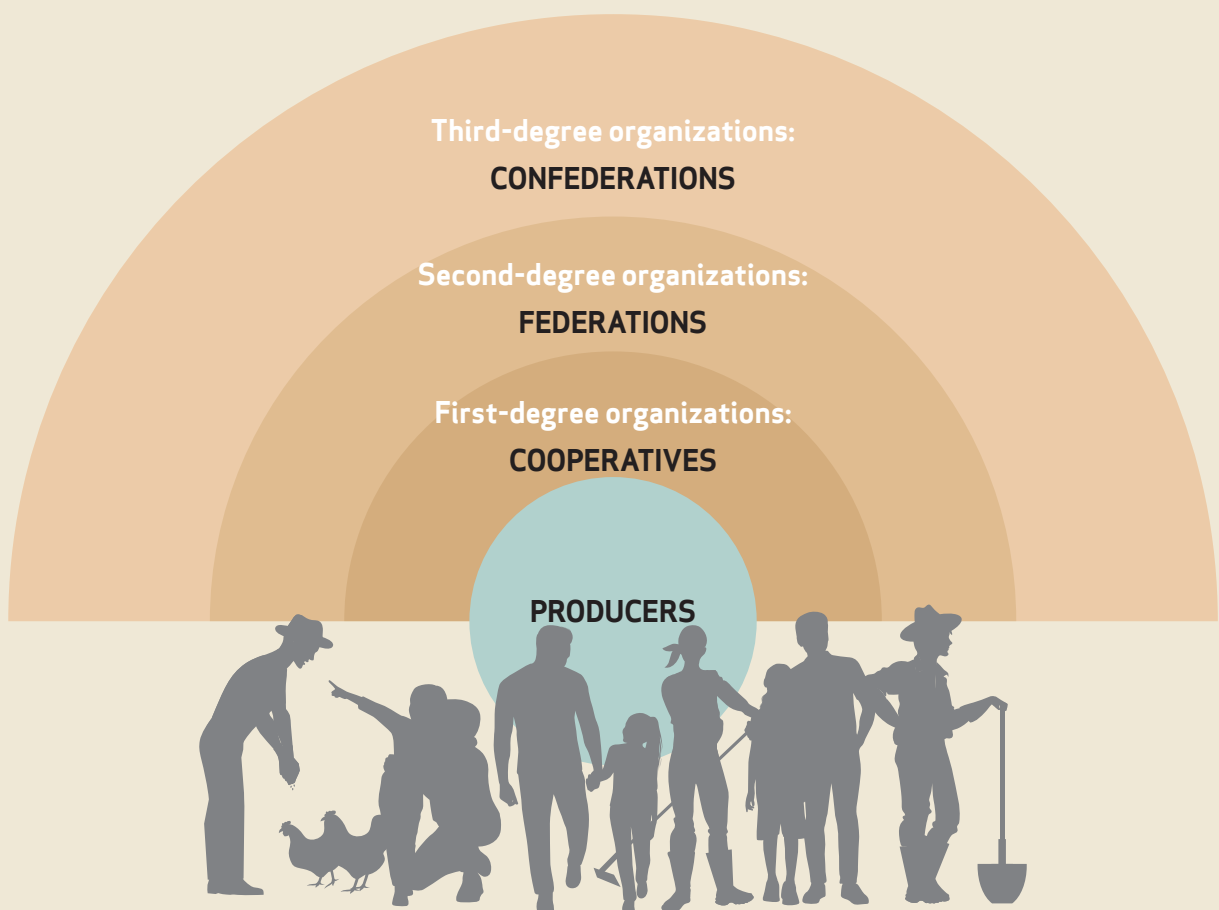
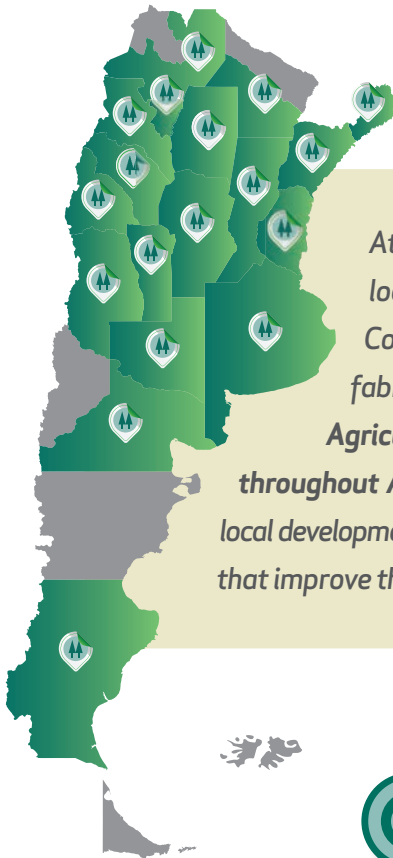


CONINAGRO

the country's different regional economies.

Our mission

Coninagro is an organization that **represents and defends the interests** of its member producers, Federations and the agribusiness sector as a whole. It works to provide solutions to the challenges faced by its members and by the agricultural sector in general, with the aim of building—through cooperativism—social capital that fosters local development and strengthens roots in rural communities.

Our vision

Coninagro is an organization that seeks to **lead agricultural advocacy** through the development and promotion of sectoral public policies. We work to become a large, highly professional institution, led by representatives with strong political and trade-union training, so that Cooperatives may serve as drivers of local development in communities throughout the interior of the country.



Cooperative values



What distinguishes Cooperatives?

Formation: Cooperatives are established to meet the needs of their members through their own efforts and collective action based on solidarity.

Ownership: a Cooperative is owned by all its members.

Democratic control: Cooperatives operate under the principle of “one member, one vote.”

Accountability: in a Cooperative the Board of Directors is accountable to all members, regardless of their relative weight within the organization.

Benefits and Surpluses: by decision of the General Assembly, surpluses are either reinvested to strengthen the Cooperative or distributed among members according to their transactions and participation.

“A Cooperative is an autonomous association of persons united voluntarily to meet their common economic, social and cultural needs and aspirations through a jointly owned and democratically controlled enterprise”.

We are the voice of cooperative agricultural producers throughout Argentina.

We are 16 Federations.

We are more than 350 Cooperatives, representing nearly 150,000 producers.

We work alongside Regional Advisory Committees in different provinces across the country, reaching producers through their Cooperatives, listening to their needs and gaining a firsthand understanding of the challenges faced by each sector.

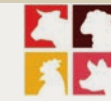

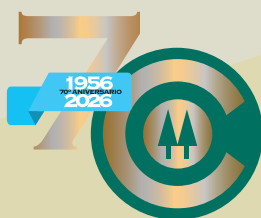
